## **BoysTown offers first ever Mooloolaba house**

BoysTown's first ever prize home in Mooloolaba opens its doors today. The luxury million dollar property, located just metres from cafes and beaches, comes after a long wait, according to the charitable art union's General Manager Fundraising, Keith Coventry.

"Mooloolaba has always been one of BoysTown Lottery's most desirable locations, but we've never managed to find a suitable detached home in the area," Keith said.

"However, we knew as soon as we walked through the doors, that this home was something special. Combined with an enviable location just metres from patrolled beaches and stylish cafes, it was clear this property was worthy of becoming our first prize home for the area".

Keith said the home, part of a prize package worth over \$1.3 million, would be ideal for a large family.

"Spread over two levels, the home has four bedrooms, including a large master suite with a parent's retreat, ensuite and walk-in robe. The lounge, dining and kitchen areas open through bi-fold doors to a stylish outdoor pavilion and in-ground pool.

"The Mooloolaba Primary School is conveniently located just down the road, so kids can walk to school. It is truly a home that will make many happy memories for a lucky family, for years to come."

Keith said that although the home's location is extremely close to beaches, cafes and shops, it also has benefit of being in a quiet street, amongst other quality properties.

The total prize package is worth \$1,301,222. The property is located at **31 Meta Street, Mooloolaba** and is open for viewing and ticket sales until Thursday 2 September 2010. Tickets are also available via [www.boystown.com.au](http://www.boystown.com.au).

All funds raised will go towards BoysTown's charitable services, which aim to give a fresh start for disadvantaged children, young people and families in need. BoysTown services include Kids Helpline, Parent Line, domestic violence refuges and employment and training services for disadvantaged young people.
